Target regions include the Gulf of Mexico, Florida lakes, the Florida Keys, the Everglades, Puerto Rico, and Tampa Bay. Ability and interest in working in the field, and participating in research cruises is important for many projects.

No experience is required - we will train in all techniques - but previous laboratory experience is helpful. Work will be conducted in newly renovated laboratories in the College of Marine Science at USF under the direct supervision of Drs. Ben Flower, Bob Byrne, Mya Breitbart, Ernst Peebles, David Hollander, David Hastings, and others.

- your resume
- an Eckerd College transcript (unofficial is OK)
- the name of at least one reference who knows you well at Eckerd.

Summer salary is \$2,500 and includes housing at Eckerd College.
