GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS WHICH MAY BE COMPLETED AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE:

Students are required to complete one course in each of four academic areas: Arts (Ex. ARH, ART, CRW, DIG, GRA, MUT, MUH, PGY, TPA, TPP prefixes), Humanities (Ex. AML, AMH, LIT, ENL, EUH, PHI, PHH, REL, WHO prefixes), Natural Science (Ex. BSC, CHM, GLY, ESC, ISC, OSE, PHY prefixes), and Social Sciences (Ex. ANT, ECO, ECP, DEP, MAN, POS, PSY, SOP, SYG prefixes). Students may meet the quantitative competency requirement by completing a math course at the College Algebra level or higher.

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO THE INDEPENDENT INSTITUTION:

Applicants are expected to be in good academic and social standing at the institution last attended. Although no single criterion is used as a determinant for acceptance and we have no minimum GPA requirement for admission, the great majority of students who gain admission to Eckerd College have a college GPA of 2.7 or higher.

Students who are admitted with an Associate of Arts degree from a Florida public community college receive junior standing. A maximum of 63 credits may be transferred from a two-year community college. Evaluations of previous college work by students who do not have an AA are conducted on a course-by-course basis.
